Anishinabe Spiritual Centre up for sale



By Rosalind Russell - The Jesuits of Canada have announced plans to give up two properties -- the Anishinabe Spiritual Centre on Lake Anderson, located just south of Espanola and Villa Loyola in Sudbury.

According to the news release, the Jesuits are willing to engage with those who may be interested ahead of a decision deadline of January 31st, 2025.

Father Jeffrey S. Burwell says after three years of study, the decision was made for the order to focus its efforts on supporting existing Catholic parishes across the North.

He says the order had to acknowledge their limitations regarding resources and reduced personnel. Father Burwell adds the order wants to sell the properties by the end of July of next year at the latest.

Villa Loyola was built in 1962 on 12 acres of land on the south shore of Long Lake and includes three conference/seminar rooms, two dining rooms, 27 carpeted bedrooms (single or double), each equipped with a private bathroom, a chapel and a specialized library/consultation room.

The Anishinabe Spiritual Centre, on property off Anderson Lake just south of Espanola, includes cabins, a chapel, a dormitory, a meeting room, a dining room and kitchen, as well as a gift shop. Screenshot by Rosalind Russell



Trojan Horse Visit To Espanola Highlights Privatization Concerns Of Health Care



By Rosalind Russell - Despite heavy rain last Friday, the "Trojan Horse" made its way to Espanola to highlight union concerns about the privatization of health care in Ontario.

Ontario Council of Hospital Unions First Vice President Kevin Cook says the giant wooden horse is a metaphor for the government's privatization policy, which he says is presented as a gift, but could be the downfall of health care in the province.

He says the Ford government says private clinics will reduce wait-times, but he believes it has created a two-tier system where people with money can get immediate care and the waiting lists continue.

Cook is also concerned the private operations are pulling away staff that is needed in public hospitals worsening the staffing crisis that is occurring.

He adds the union will be continuing its tour throughout the northeast to share information and highlight the importance of the issue to the wider public.

David Tremblay, the CUPE Vice President for Northeastern Ontario, who is employed at Health Sciences North, concurs with Cook adding the private, for-profit clinics are unaffordable.

He adds the strategy of privatizing health care is a dangerous precedent and the unions will continue to fight to prevent it from becoming the new normal in Ontario.



Hughes Receives Complaints About Flyers Claiming Government Money For Medical Conditions

Rosalind Russell Households around Algoma-Manitoulin-Kapuskasing have been receiving mail from a private company who claim the public can receive up to \$50,000 from the Government of Canada. but NDP MP Carol Hughes is warning constituents that this mailing is not from the federal provincial governments. Hughes says constituents have been contacting her offices with concerns about flyers from a company called Ontario Benefits, adding, while light on details, the flyer indicates people can get money from the feds for having several medical conditions.

Hughes warns neither level of government would send people a unilingual flyer telling them they can get paid for their medical condition, and she's warning people not to provide questionable organizations with personal information.

Hughes adds she can't say for certain what sort of services, if any, this company provides, and even if they are operating legally, police organizations already issued warnings about it. She says if individuals have questions about qualifying for government benefits, they can call her office to get the correct links for services they may need. Hughes says it is unclear who runs Ontario Benefits, but the flyer lists several medical conditions, such as ADHD, cancer, and irritable bowels, and states people of all ages and medical conditions can qualify. It asks people to call a toll-free number for more information, or text another number with your name and mailing address for an "information package.

It also lists a website that has very little information on it.
