Rainbow Schools Take Part In Take Our Kids To Work On November 6th

Grade 9 students in Rainbow Schools will spend the day at work shadowing a parent, guardian, relative, friend or volunteer host on Wednesday, November 6, 2024 as part of the national Take Our Kids to Work program.

"Take Our Kids to Work Day encourages Grade 9 students to make connections between the classroom and the world of work," says Bruce Bourget, Director of Education for Rainbow District School Board. "This event reinforces the importance of obtaining a secondary school diploma."

He adds: "Local employers have an important role to play in preparing their future workforce. This day will serve as a catalyst to engage students in career discussions with role models in various sectors."

Now in its 30th year, the Take Our Kids to Work program provides Grade 9 students with the opportunity to experience the world of work as they explore possible career

Each year, some 200,000 Grade 9 students and over 75,000 businesses and organizations

participate in Take Our Kids to Work Day across Canada.

The Learning Partnership began the program in Ontario in 1994, and has since expanded to reach students in all provinces and territories. The Student Commission of Canada, a charitable organization that works to empower young people, their peers and communities, now facilitates the program.

Students can obtain information about Take Our Kids to Work at area Rainbow secondary schools. Parents/guardians of participating students will be required to complete and sign a consent form. Parents/guardians should check with employers about any age restrictions for placement.

Employers are encouraged to identify information that students will need to know in advance to ensure a safe workplace visit. All Grade 9 students will receive Workplace Health and Safety Awareness training in preparation for their day in the world of work.

New Triplex Approved By Espanola Despite Protest

To whom it may concern,

Lam writing to express my strong opposition to the proposed housing development of 134 Syroid Street, application # 205-24 and # 806/24.

1 believe this project would have a detrimental impact on on our neighbourhood and community.

First and foremost, the proposed development is simply too large for our area. A triplex on a single lot is inappropriate and unacceptable as there is untouched land in Espanola and the surrounding area that could be used instead

The increase in population would negatively impact our street due to increased traffic, noise pollution, and would put a strain on our public services. This would also alter the aesthetic of our area by replacing greenery, open space, and single-family homes with a high-density complex. The proposed triplex is not in conformity with the character of the surrounding properties. Property values are likely to decrease in the area if multi-family homes are built, as they are inconsistent with the neighborhood developed in the area.

However, a single-family home would be a better fit for this single-lot property

If we allow for this to happen, how many more multi-family homes will be built on single lots?

I strongly urge you to reconsider this proposed housing development. I believe this project is not the right fit for our neighborhood and will negatively impact our community.

Rosalind Russell Espanola council has given its approval to the construction of a new triplex in town despite protests by several residents.

Council held a public hearing last Tuesday for input on the construction of a new triplex for 134 Syroid Street.

Several residents were in attendance and were vocal in their opposition to the build asking that a single-family dwelling be considered instead.

Mayor Doug Gervais pointed out that the number one priority of the Strategic Plan is new housing, which is considered a crisis in Espanola.

Councillor Aidan Kallionen

says he understands the concerns raised but adds there are hundreds of people on the waiting list for housing in Espanola and he must consider the wider community and the benefits of a new build, including more taxes and attracting new people.

Deputy Mayor Angela Kelly also stated it is a priority and their mandate as council to grow the town.

Council approved the zoning amendment bylaw, the project will now move forward.
