By Rosalind Russell - Flags were lowered to half-mast at all municipal facilities on September 4th, in honour of former Espanola Mayor Ron Piche who has passed away.

A long-time resident of Espanola, Piche served Espanola as Mayor from 2014 to 2018.

One of Piche's biggest accomplishments was bringing in the Ontario Provincial Police in 2018, the hot button issue when he ran for mayor four years before. Piche had promised a referendum on the







By Rosalind Russell - Espanola council, admin staff and Algoma-Manitoulin MPP Mike Mantha gathered at the Espanola Regional Recreation Complex to mark the installation of the new HVAC air system.

Espanola Mayor Doug Gervais says last year the facility was in desperate need of a new Make-Up Air Unit, (MUA) to filter and heat air in the complex, thanking the staff for carrying out the work to bring the project to fruition.

Gervais says the Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF) provided just over \$58,000 to pay for the new unit and the contribution is much appreciated.

Mantha also acknowledged the importance of the foundation providing the funding, which is fully paid for, to allow safe, healthy access to the facility. "For years, I have enjoyed many opportunities to visit the

many opportunities to visit the Espanola Regional Recreation Complex. No matter when I come, it's always a bustling place," says Mantha, who went on to observe that the community is fortunate to have such a fine facility at its disposal.

"Now, with OTF's generous support, the Complex has been able to upgrade its environmental controls and conditions to make it safer, healthier and more enjoyable. As I see it, the improvements are not an expense, but rather an investment and vote of confidence by the foundation in the community."

Rural Economic Development Program To **Help Boost The Local Economy**

By Rosalind Russell - The government Ontario investing more than \$5.7 million in 85 projects including two in our local area that create jobs and boost economic development in rural communities across the province.

Lisa Thompson, Minister of Rural Affairs, says the funding through the recent intake of the Rural Economic Development program, supports projects that diversify and grow local economies, build community capacity and address barriers

to economic development and labour force challenges.

Locally, the City of Elliot Lake will implement an ecoand geo-tourism strategy to promote local tourism to a broader market throughout Canada with a \$16,176 grant. The Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will also \$2,566 to receive erect cultural heritage banners within the township, specifically featuring local veterans, to promote culture and community engagement.


