## **Interruption To Water Fluoridation In Espanola's Municipal Water Supply**

There are no immediate health risks to the continue to protect their dental health public. Optimizing the levels of fluoride in drinking water systems is a safe and effective way to prevent tooth decay. The interruption to fluoridation means that residents who receive their water supply from the Espanola Water Treatment Plant are not receiving optimal amounts of fluoride through their drinking water.

In accordance with the requirements of the Ontario Public Health Standards, Public Health Sudbury & Districts reviews drinking water quality reports for all municipal drinking water supplies in which fluoride is added, and is required to inform affected residents when fluoride concentrations in their water supply fall outside the therapeutic levels (0.6-0.8 ppm) for more than 90 consecutive days. Repairs to the system are underway and water fluoridation will resume once they

& Districts will continue to monitor the fluoride concentration returns to optimal levels in Espanola.

Affected residents can ensure that they by brushing their teeth with fluoridated toothpaste. Residents at higher risk of tooth decay or who have any concerns about the impact of the reduced fluoride levels on their oral health, may wish to consult their family dentist regarding additional preventive measures. The use of additional products containing fluoride must be recommended by an oral health professional after an assessment of individual oral health and risk for tooth decay.

# No Cell Phones For Kids At School

By Rosalind Russell - Students in As for all Grade 7 to 12 students, phones Espanola will join their Rainbow Board counterparts with no cell phones in the classroom.

In response to a directive from the Ministry of Education, the board's new Administrative Procedure on Personal Mobile Devices comes into effect when classes resume Tuesday, September 3rd. Director of Education Bruce Bourget says eliminating distractions will protect instructional time and enable educators and students to focus on teaching and learning.

He says for students in Grade 6 and below, phones are to be stored out of view in their personal space and powered off or set to silent/do not disturb mode throughout the full instructional day.

are to be stored in lockers or assigned personal spaces out of view and powered off or set to silent/do not disturb mode during the instructional period.

Bourget says access to social media sites will also be restricted throughout the school day.


He stresses cell phone use will be permitted for educational purposes, as directed by an educator, and, in specific situations, for health and medical purposes and to support special education needs.

Mobile device use in secondary schools will be permitted before the start of the school day, at lunch and after school.

## Letter To Nairn & Hyman Township Outlines Process To Dispose Of Low Radiation Material

*By Rosalind Russell* - The Ministry of Mines says the process to move low radiation material from Nipissing First Nation to the decommissioned Agnew Lake Mines site has been in the works for a while.

In a letter to Nairn & Hyman Township, ministry spokesperson Erik Cobbs says the ministry will take several steps for remediation if the Agnew Lake Mine site is used to dispose of the material commonly called NORM.

Cobbs says the mine tailings area was identified as the preferred receiving site for the material from a mine east of Sudbury, adding it had been originally deposited on Nipissing First Nation reserve land adjacent to a Ministry of Transportation aggregate pit.

He says the waste products are not considered hazardous waste but have been classified as naturally occurring radioactive material noting they cannot be brought to regular landfills sites. He adds the radiation shielding at the current site would be improved and be sufficient to mitigate radiation doses to nonpermanent site users.

Cobbs says the mines Waste Nuclear Substance Licence was renewed in 2020 allowing the move to the Agnew Lake Mine Tailings Site adding it would be covered with at least one metre of soil cover, topsoil and rehabilitation greenery.

Cobbs says an assessment of possible environmental and public health and safety risks depositing NORM to the Agnew site would not increase the environmental, public health or safety risk as it relates to radioactivity, radon inhalation or contaminants of concern.
