All-Candidates Debate For Local Area Being Held On Manitoulin

The Manitoulin Expositor is hosting the debate on Wednesday, February 12th at the Freshwater Community Church in Mindemoya (behind the grocery store). The candidates running in the Algoma-Manitoulin Riding include incumbent,

Independent Mike Mantha, Liberal Reg Niganobe, New Democratic Party candidate David Timeriski, Progressive Conservative Bill Rosenberg and Green Party Maria Legault.

Doors open at 6:30 pm and voters from Manitoulin Island and the North Shore Corridor are invited to attend.

Local Turtle Defenders Win 2024 Eugene Rogers Environmental Award



By Rosalind Russell - Three local environmentalists have received a prestigious award for their work in protecting turtles along the North Shore Corridor.

Jenifer Brousseau, Rhonda and Tom Kirby, received the 2024 Eugene Rogers Environmental Award for inspiring leadership and community engagement to protect the Serpent River watershed, wetlands and Blanding's turtles.

Jenifer Brousseau is a member of the Serpent River First Nation and Rhonda and Tom Kirby are residents of the Township of the North Shore.

Officials say the Kirbys have worked tirelessly to raise awareness about the potential detrimental environmental impacts of a proposed 100-year lease for a rock quarry near their home in the Serpent River watershed on the north shore of Lake Huron near Blind River.

They add, Jenifer Brousseau, an Anishnaabe/ Cree and French interdisciplinary artist and teacher led the campaign to protect the Serpent River watershed from destructive resource extraction.

Through her engagement with elders and youth, and a documentary titled "Ten



Thousand Turtles," she's sharing Indigenous knowledge and relationship building to guide the long-term stewardship of the lands and waters.

This year marks the 33rd anniversary of the Eugene Rogers Environmental Award.

The Wilderness Committee presents it each year, accompanied by a \$1,000 contribution, to individuals who demonstrate exceptional dedication to protecting the environment and fostering societal change.

The involvement of the Indigenous communities of Serpent River, Garden River and Mississaugi First Nations has been a key factor in delaying the proposed quarry while consultation takes place. Tom, Rhonda and Jenifer have all played key roles informing the communities of the threats to water and wildlife. Most recently, they led the community in erecting a sign to mark the location as traditional and treaty territory of the Robinson-Huron Anishinaabek and as an Indigenous ceremonial site for speciesat-risk.

"Rhonda and Tom Kirby, and Jenifer Brousseau, are true examples of how dedication to land and water can inspire communities and build the connections necessary to propel people-powered environmental protections on the local level," said Katie Krelove, Wilderness Committee Ontario Campaigner. "It has been a gift to organize with and learn from them as we continue to hold the government accountable to laws and regulations meant to conserve species at risk."

Espanola/Sudbury Receiving Supports For Housing

By Rosalind Russell - The federal government has reached agreements with nearly two dozen Ontario communities, including Espanola and Greater Sudbury, to accelerate housing construction.

All told, over 42-hundred homes will be built in 23 communities over the next three years.

Officials say 138-million dollars is being provided to eliminate barriers to building much-needed homes faster.

There aren't any specifics on the funding as yet.

The feds say action plans are required by communities to tap into the money from the Housing Accelerator Fund, with subsequent payments after results are delivered.

Across Canada, officials say the fund is cutting red tape and fast-tracking at least 112-thousand new homes by 2028.


