College Strike Averted In Ontario



By Rosalind Russell - A strike at Ontario's 24 public colleges, including Cambrian, has been averted.

After more than six months of negotiations, the bargaining team representing over 15,000 college faculty across Ontario has signed a Memorandum of Agreement.

The Ontario Public Service Employees Union (OPSEU) says there are significant benefit gains.

Officials say while the two sides otherwise remain at an impasse, the parties have agreed to send all outstanding items to mediation-arbitration. The union says as a result, Ontario's 24 public colleges will avoid a strike this term.

"Faculty working conditions are student learning conditions, and with a historic strike mandate and province-wide organizing, faculty sent the clear message that we're ready to stand up to protect both," says Ravi Ramkissoonsingh, chair of the faculty bargaining team.

OPSEU, and the College Employer Council (CEC), the bargaining agent for Ontario's 24 public colleges, met in downtown Toronto over the course of January 6-7 in mediation.

"We are pleased to have averted an unnecessary strike at Ontario's 24 public Colleges," says Graham Lloyd, CEO, of CEC. "Our goal throughout negotiations has been to recognize the hard work of academic employees and to keep students in class." A new contract for college faculty will be ruled on at a further date by Arbitrator William Kaplan.

commitment to rural and Northern and \$2.3 million to the City of Greater municipalities recognizing municipalities need predictability so they can plan and deliver projects.

She announced \$8.68 million for the City of Elliot Lake while visiting the city.

She also made a stop in Massey to present the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers with its allocation of \$1.94 million.

Last Monday, she announced \$1.6 million for the Municipality of Central Manitoulin, \$1.94 million for Espanola Photos provided – Espanola & Massey

Thompson says all five announcements were an increase over last year ranging from six to 13 percent supporting areas with limited property assessment of investment in key local infrastructure.

She adds other municipalities will also be receiving similar supports through the program.

Water And Sewer Rate Hike Comes Into Effect In Espanola

By Rosalind Russell - Ratepayers in facilities. Espanola will see a slight increase in their water and sewer rates this year.

At its last meeting in December, Espanola council rescinded the previous bylaw and passed a new one to cover a shortfall reported back in the Spring of 2024.

In her report, department manager Julie Bouthillette stated water and sewer rates are failing to generate enough revenue to cover the increased of operating the town's water and sewer treatment

She projected the water and sewer rates would leave a 20% shortfall, so council agreed to two increases, with a phased in water and sewer adjustment implemented last July for a monthly increase of \$10.19 per month.

The new bylaw allows for the second increase of \$10.19 per month effective January 2025.

It also includes a 10 percent increase to the commercial rates.

Public Health Continues To Monitor Fluoride Concentrations In Espanola

Rosalind Russell concentrations in the Espanola water supply are currently below the therapeutic levels recommended according to Public Health Sudbury & Districts.

The agency says there are no immediate or short-term health risks to the public. However, over the long-term, if fluoride levels are not kept at optimal levels, residents and especially children are at greater risk for tooth decay.

The health unit says the fluoridization process was halted from May through

Fluoride September for repairs to be made, but due to ongoing technical problems, residents are not currently receiving optimal amounts of fluoride through their drinking water.

> The agency continues to monitor the levels while repairs are underway and will update the public when the levels return to normal.
